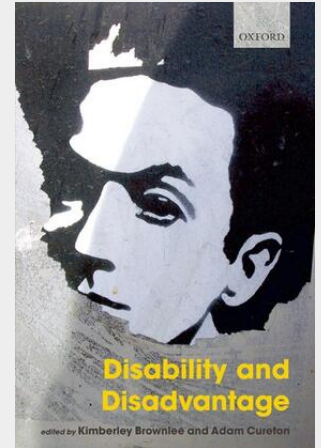


DISABILITY & DISADVANTAGE
