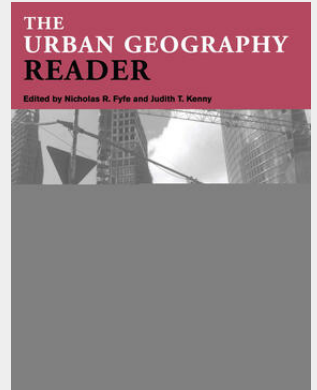


The Urban Geography Reader
