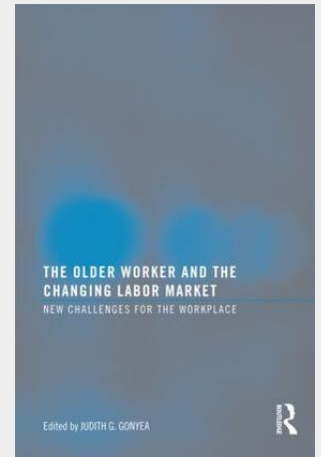


The Older Worker and the Changing Labor Market
