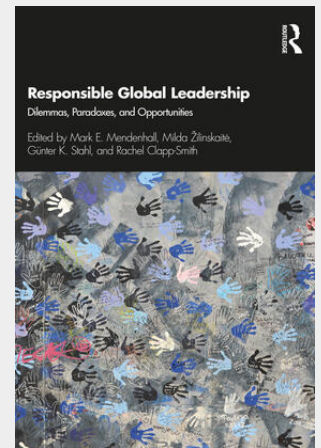


Responsible Global Leadership
