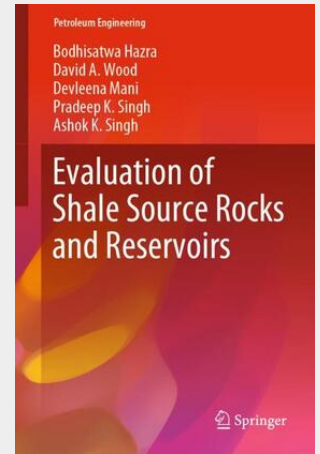


Evaluation of Shale Source Rocks and Reservoirs
