Griechische und lateinische Quellenstücke von Hippokrates bis Galen. Welche Fortschritte die Medizin nahm, nachdem man nicht mehr Dämonen als Verursacher von Krankheiten verantwortlich machte, weist Walter Müris Sammlung medizinischer Quellentexte nach.
